Working out your own Salvation: The Misconceptions

Philippians 2 v 12-13

- We have to figure it out ourselves! <a> \interpretarrow
- We have to 'work for' our salvation
- The tone and context of the chapter was not a stern rebuke or admonition (fear & trembling)
- Paul's command can be viewed from an individual and a corporate perspective









Working out your own salvation: What does it mean?

Philippians 2 v 12-13

'Work out' (katergazomi) - To continually work to bring something to fruition or completion – (alluding to a process)

- <u>Justification</u> We are made 'right' with God through faith in Christ Jesus who paid the sacrifice for sin on the cross
- <u>Sanctification</u> The ongoing process of being made 'holy' to become more like Christ and to be used God's special purpose
- Glorification –When Christ returns, sin will be finally removed from the saints and the sanctification process will be complete











The call to Shine in a dark world












¹⁴ Do everything without grumbling or arguing, ¹⁵ so that you may become blameless and pure, "children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation." 

How do we avoid it?

Philippians 2 v 16

- 'Address it' Matthew 18: 15-17: 'If a brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him. If he hears you, you have gained a brother.'
- 'Let it go' Proverbs 17:14: 'starting a quarrel is like breaching a dam; So drop the matter before a dispute breaks out' – The want or 'lust' for vindication
- 'Work on it' Colossians 3:12-13: 'Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, long suffering; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do.'

¹⁷ But even if I am being poured out like a drink offering on the sacrifice and service coming from your faith, I am glad and rejoice with all of you. ¹⁸ So you too should be glad and rejoice with me.
