- God is holy
- We can't set what is sin or it's wages
- We can't call sin something God hasn't

- (Awon) crookedness. It denotes not an action, but the character of an action
- (Pesha) Refers to ways that people violate the trust of others, like the betrayal of a relationship
- Asham ("sin"), is used very frequently in the Old Testament. Violation of law of which God is the author
- KHATA miss the mark











# WE ARE ALL **TEMPTED**

#### James 1:14-15 / AMP

<sup>14.</sup> But each one is tempted when he is dragged away, enticed and baited [to commit sin] by his own [worldly] desire (lust, passion). <sup>15.</sup> Then when the illicit desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin has run its course, it gives birth to death.

- The devil knows man well
- He wants you to feel condemned
- Like you are not worthy









# WHAT'S WRONG WITH ME?

#### **Romans 7:15 / AMP**

<sup>15</sup> For I do not understand my own actions [I am baffled and bewildered by them]. I do not practice what I want to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate [and yielding to my human nature, my worldliness—my sinful capacity].

#### 1 John 3:8-9

<sup>8</sup> Whoever makes a practice of sinning is of the devil, for the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil. <sup>9</sup> No one born of God makes a practice of sinning, for God's seed abides in him; and he cannot keep on sinning, because he has been born of God.

- Intentional sin, with an unrepentant heart
- Unintentional sin, with a repentant heart









## **HOMOLOGEŌ**

The word has the literal meaning of "to say the same thing." In the New Testament, homologeō is often translated as "confess" or "confession."









- We are all saved by grace
- He died for you before you stopped sinning
- The Lord's prayer includes forgiveness

#### **Romans 6:1-2 / ESV**

1. What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? 2. By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it?

#### Philippians 2:13 / AMP

For it is [not your strength, but it is] God who is effectively at work in you, both to will and to work [that is, strengthening, energizing, and creating in you the longing and the ability to fulfil your purpose] [for His good pleasure.











# Colossians 1:21-23 / AMP

<sup>21</sup> And although you were at one time estranged and alienated and hostile-minded [toward Him], participating in evil things, <sup>22</sup> yet Christ has now reconciled you [to God] in His physical body through death, in order to present you before the Father holy and blameless and beyond reproach <sup>23</sup> [and He will do this] if you continue in the faith, well-grounded and steadfast, and not shifting away from the [confident] hope [that is a result] of the gospel that you have heard, which was proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which [gospel] I, Paul, was made a minister.







- Jesus does not condemn you
- Acknowledge your sin
- Confess your sin
- Stop living a lifestyle of sin
- Allow him to change you by getting closer to him
