What is giving Biblically?

Giving is a spiritual act of worship that brings honour to God. (Proverbs 3: 9-10)

Giving is a freewill response to God's prescribed order. (2 Corinthians 9:7-8)



What does our giving say about us?

- Cain & Able (Genesis 4: 1-16) Rejected Offering
- Widow's mite (Luke 21: 1-4) Out of her poverty gave everything
- Rich Young Ruler (Matthew 19: 16-22) where do we put our Faith and Trust?



What is Generosity?

- Generosity is the spiritual discipline that underpins the way we should give.
- The quality of being plentiful or large'
- •Generosity is a matter of the heart



Tithing - Old Testament

- Sacred Covenant between God and the Israelites
- Wasn't just a singular act of 10% but a Multi-faceted practice
- With the purpose of honouring God and servicing the needs of the community
- Serves as a blueprint for righteousness, justice and faithful stewardship (Psalm 89:14)



Tithing - Old Testament

- Levitical Tithe* (10%) (Numbers: 18:21-24)
- Festival Tithe (10%) (Deut: 14:22-27)
- Poor Tithe** (10%) (Deut 14:28-29)

*Also includes the tithe of tithe (Numbers: 18:26-32) **at the end of the third year in a 7-year cycle



Tithing - The Levitical Tithe

- WHAT: A tenth of all their agricultural produce to be paid to the Levites
- WHY: The Levites were specifically 'set apart' to assist the Priests in carrying out sacred duties in the Tabernacle
- WHO: The other 11 tribes of Israel were instructed by God to set aside this tithe
- PRINCIPLE: Honouring those who labour in God's House and acknowledging the sacredness of their tasks to God





Tithing - The Festival Tithe

- WHAT: A tenth of all their crops harvested each year
- WHY: To Feast in God's presence with their households in joyous celebration
- WHO: The other 11 tribes of Israel were instructed by God to set aside this tithe
- PRINCIPLE: To acknowledge God as the source of their blessings in all reverence; feasting and fellowshipping together



Tithing - The Poor Tithe

- WHAT: A tenth of all their agricultural produce to be gathered in a central storehouse every 3rd & 6th year
- WHY: To care for the widows, orphans, foreigners & Levites who would not have benefitted from the Harvest
- WHO: The other 11 tribes of Israel were instructed by God to set aside this tithe
- PRINCIPLE: To promote God's heart for righteousness, justice and compassion for all mankind



Tithing - Old Testament

Did they always keep the Covenant? NOPE!

Tithing - New Testament

- Jesus became the perfect embodiment of the Law
- Therefore, sin was perfectly atoned for
- No longer the requirement to tithe specific amounts under the Law
- But the spirit of the Law still applies in *principle* and *purpose*



Tithing - New Testament Principles

- Honouring those who labour in God's House
- Acknowledging God as the source of our blessings in all reverence
- Promoting God's heart for righteousness, justice and compassion for all mankind

I've **got** to give under the **Law**

I get to give under Grace



Tithing - New Testament

Giving for the church now is based on *sacrificial, freewill* offerings given generously.

The Call to Generosity (2Cor 8:1-5)

- Their first action was to give themselves to the Lord'
- They were being tested with many troubles, and were very poor'
- But they were filled with *abundant joy*, which *overflowed in rich generosity*'
- They gave far more... and did it of their own free will
- They begged us for the *privilege of sharing in the gift* for the believers in Jerusalem



The Heart of Generosity (1Chr 29:10-15)

- Worship Acknowledgement of just who He is in worship and adoration
- Everything I have belongs to God (Verse 12); and I am simply a steward of my possessions (Deut 8:18)
- The Privilege of giving to God (Verse 14)
- My giving should be sacrificial, (2 Samuel 24:24)
- Life on this earth is temporary; I will treasure what I value most (Matt 6:21)
